

Writing Educational Research

Summer School on Academic Writing for International/European Journals Conferences, Edited Books and Thesis.

EERA e.V. and the University of Gothenburg would like to announce their second annual summer school on writing educational research. The course will offer 70 European students of education the chance to enhance their writing skills over a five days training course.

Participants will work on their own research papers and **can earn 7.5 ECTS** points by handing in preparatory texts before the course, and a full paper after the course. Participation will be free and students from Low GDP countries can apply for support for housing costs.

Writing Educational Research - Aims of the Course

The course aims to introduce and practice academic writing skills in order to educate the next generation of European educational researchers to write research papers in English. The second aim is to introduce and educate research students to collaborate in European networks by furthering their networking within the European educational research space.

The summer school 2011 will take place at the University of Gothenburg, Sweden, 13 - 17 June of 2011. The general format of this 5 day course will mix introductory talks on academic writing and writing for English language journals etc. with workshops where students can practice and discuss with peers under the supervision of experienced researchers.

The EERSS is a formal course for doctoral students to be given at the University of Gothenburg. As such, students can gain 7.5 ECTS if their full paper submission meets course criteria. Students who do not submit a full paper following the summer school will receive a certificate of participation

Applicants must be in the middle of their Doctoral study/PhD programme.

- Decision on applications: 30 March
- Deadline for housing support applications: 30 April

Course Requirements

- Submission of a 250 word abstract of research paper (compulsory): 30 April
- Submission of a 4000 word / 10 page paper outline (compulsory): 25 May
- Submission of full paper (only those who wish to receive ECTS points): 1 September
